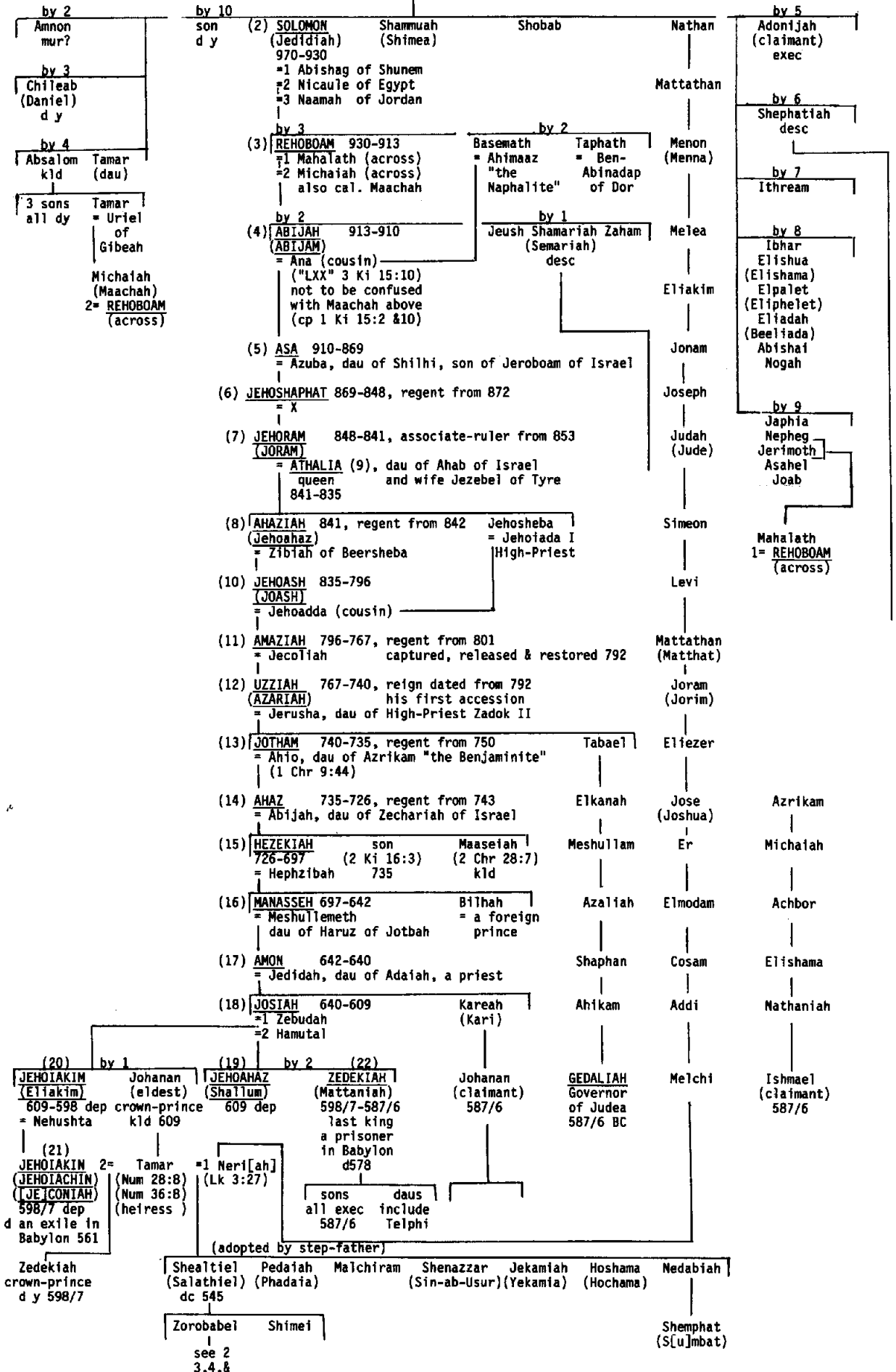


Table 02: the dynasty's post-exilic main-line

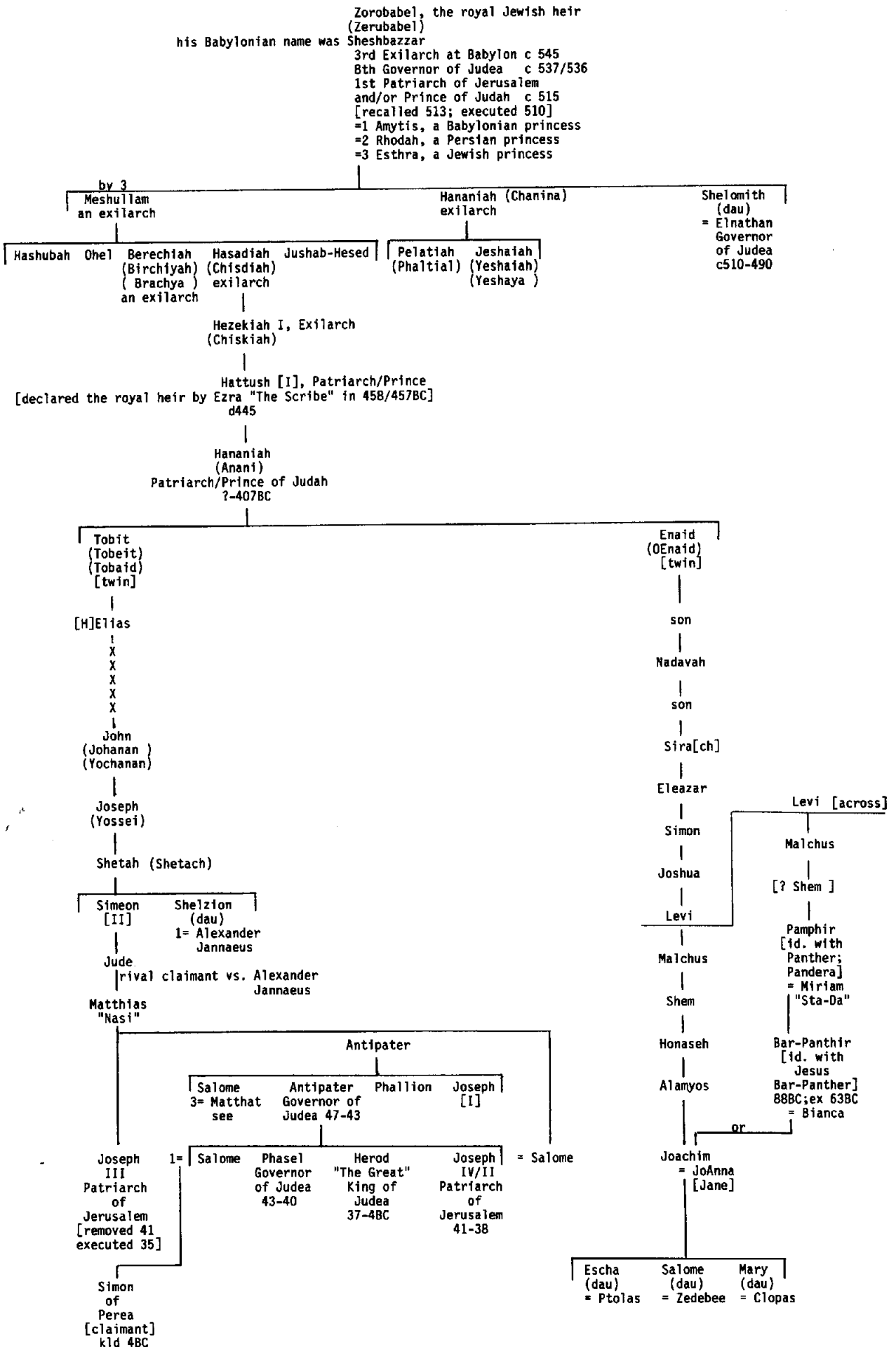
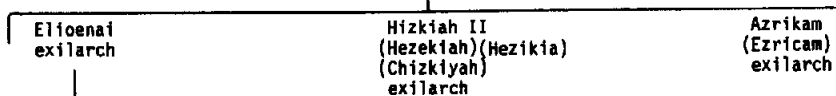
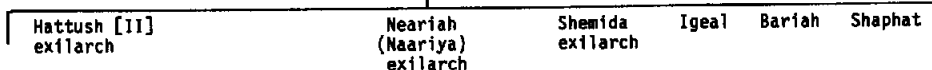
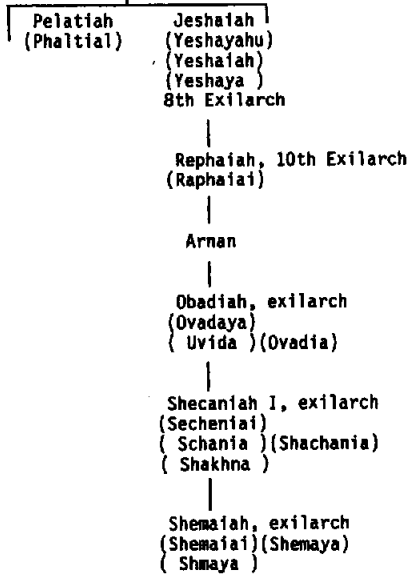
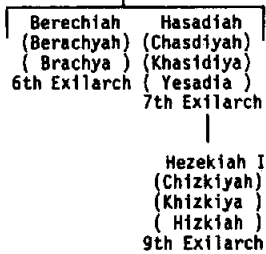
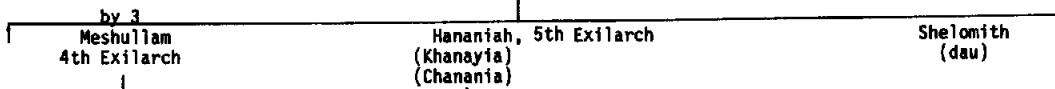


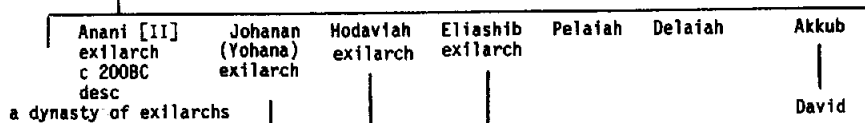

 [born same day of father's execution; son of the Babylonian Exilarch Mar-Zutra II; was carried as an infant to Palestine, where as an adult he was accepted as "Nasi" or "Patriarch", and, founded a new dynasty of the Palestinian "Nesi'im", circa 550]

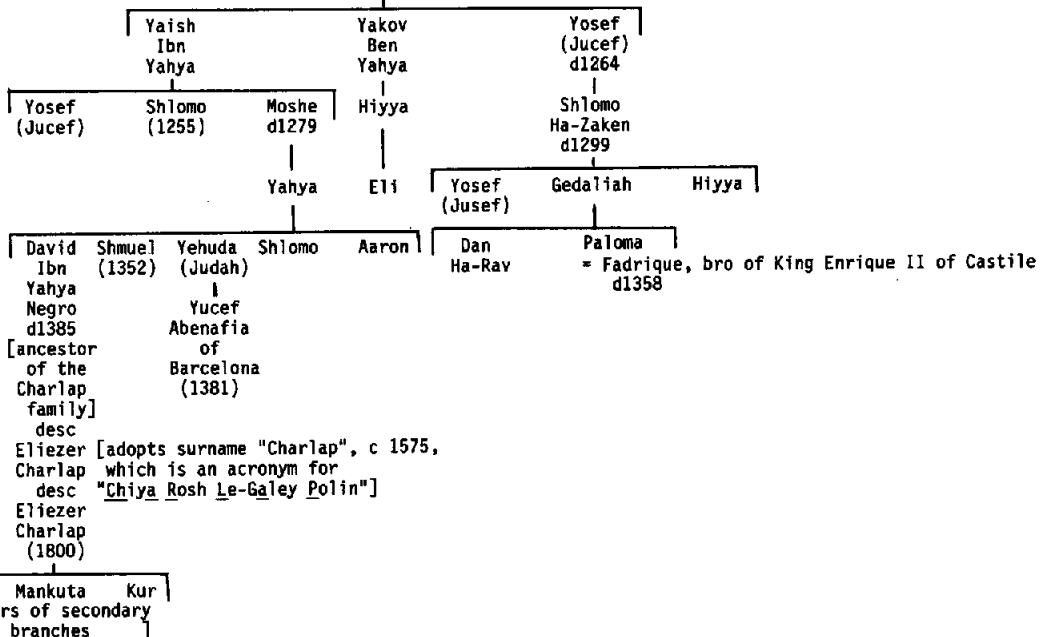


Table 07: medieval Jewish exilarchs: House of Bostanai

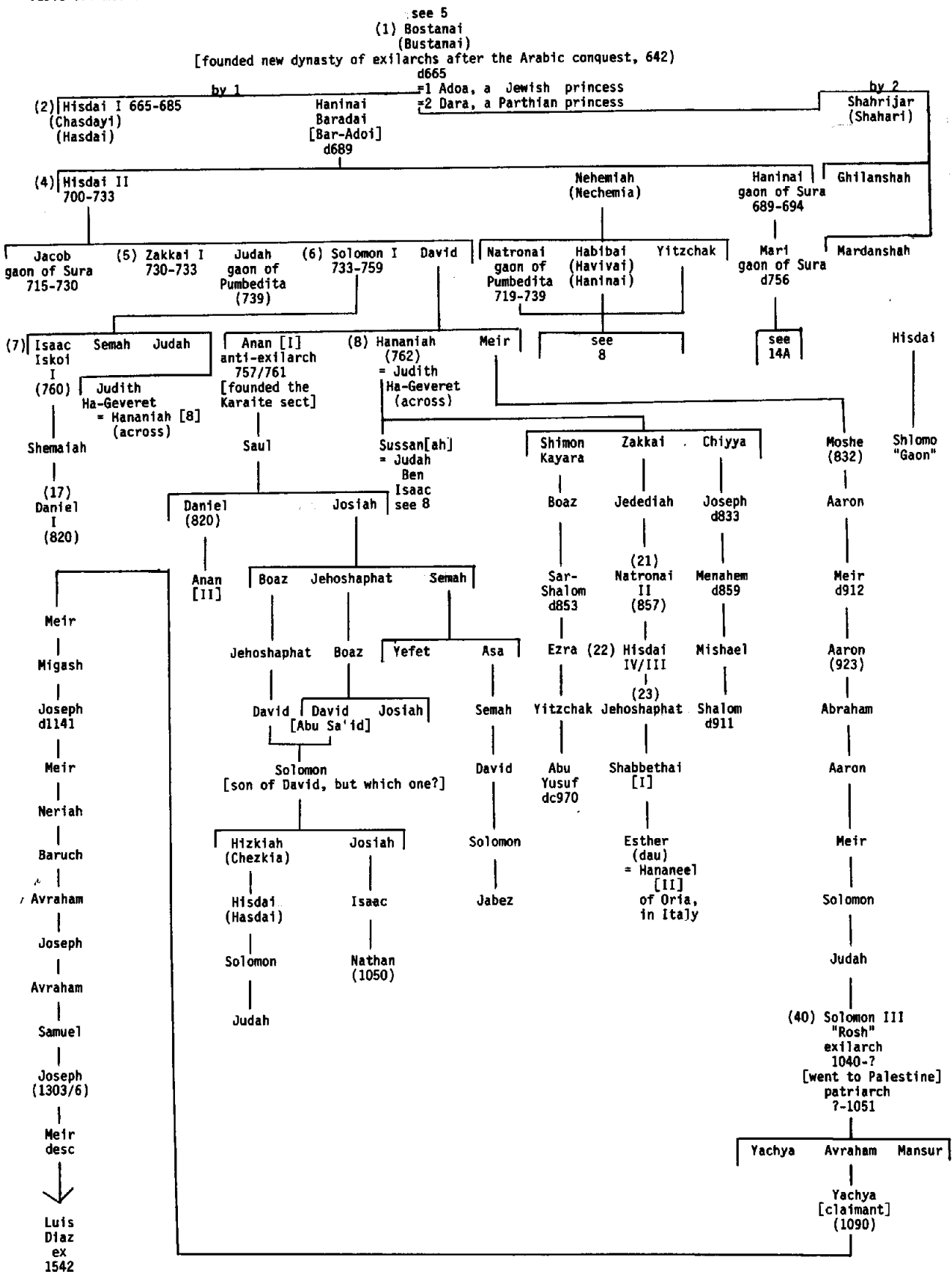
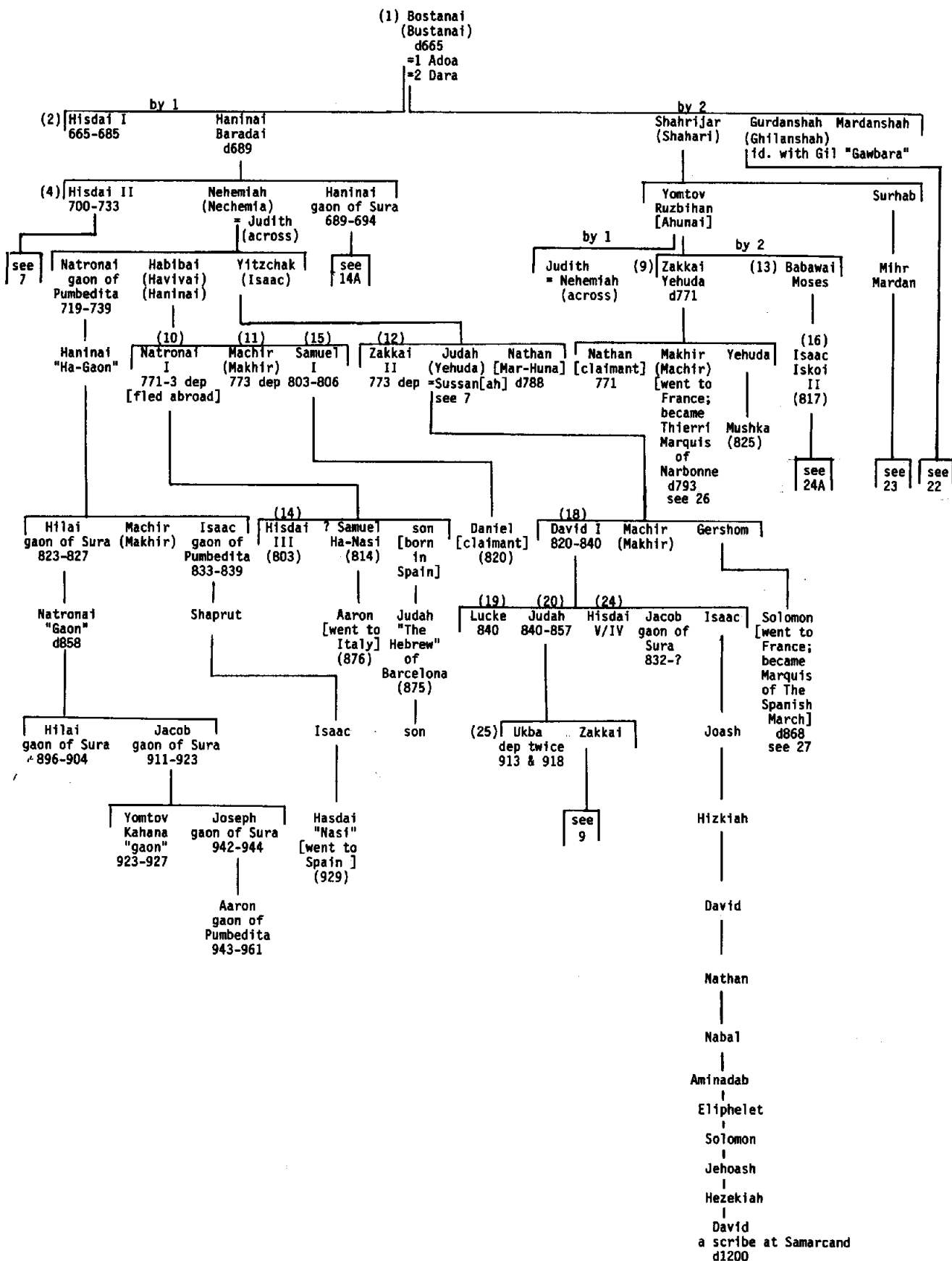

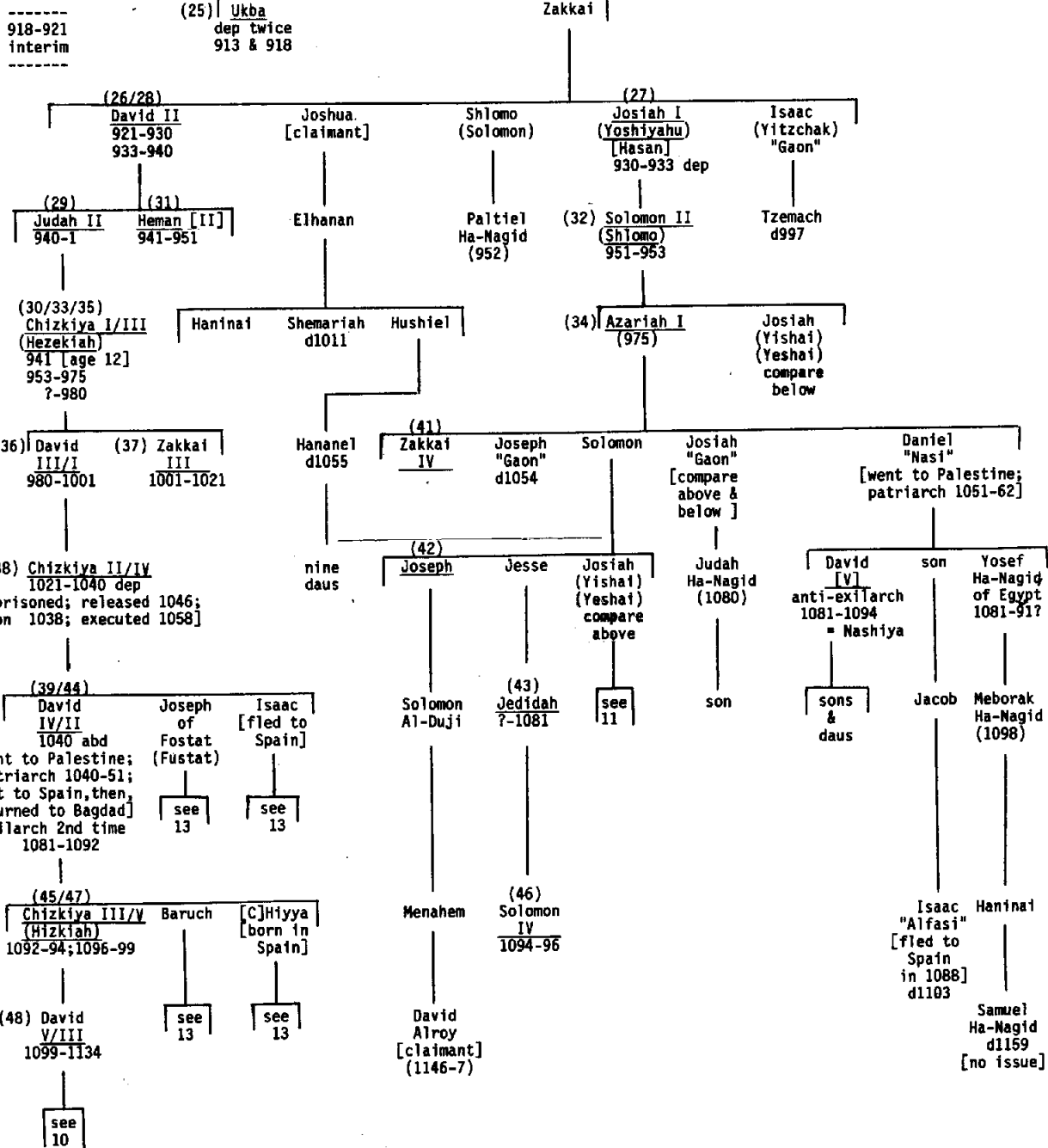

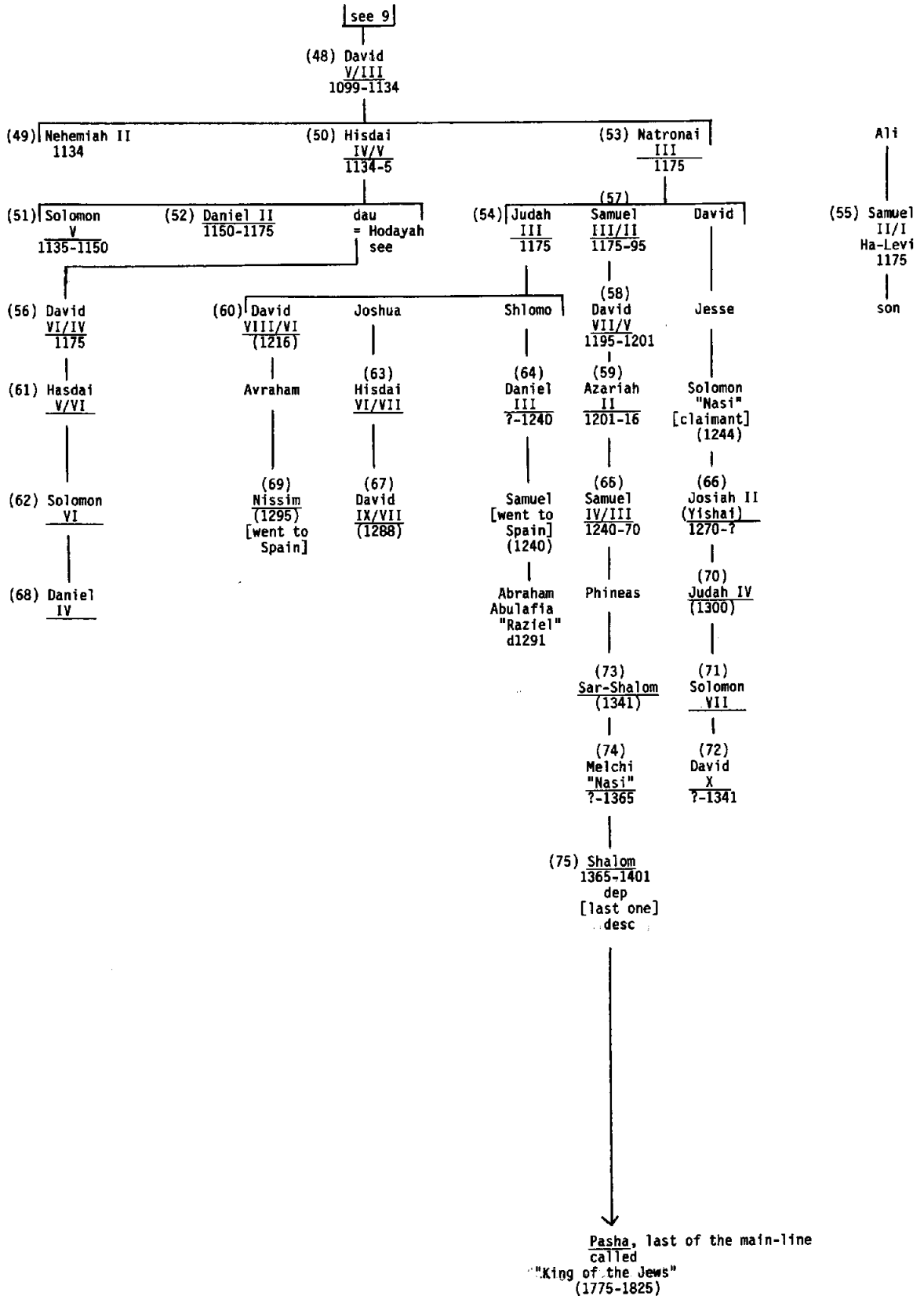
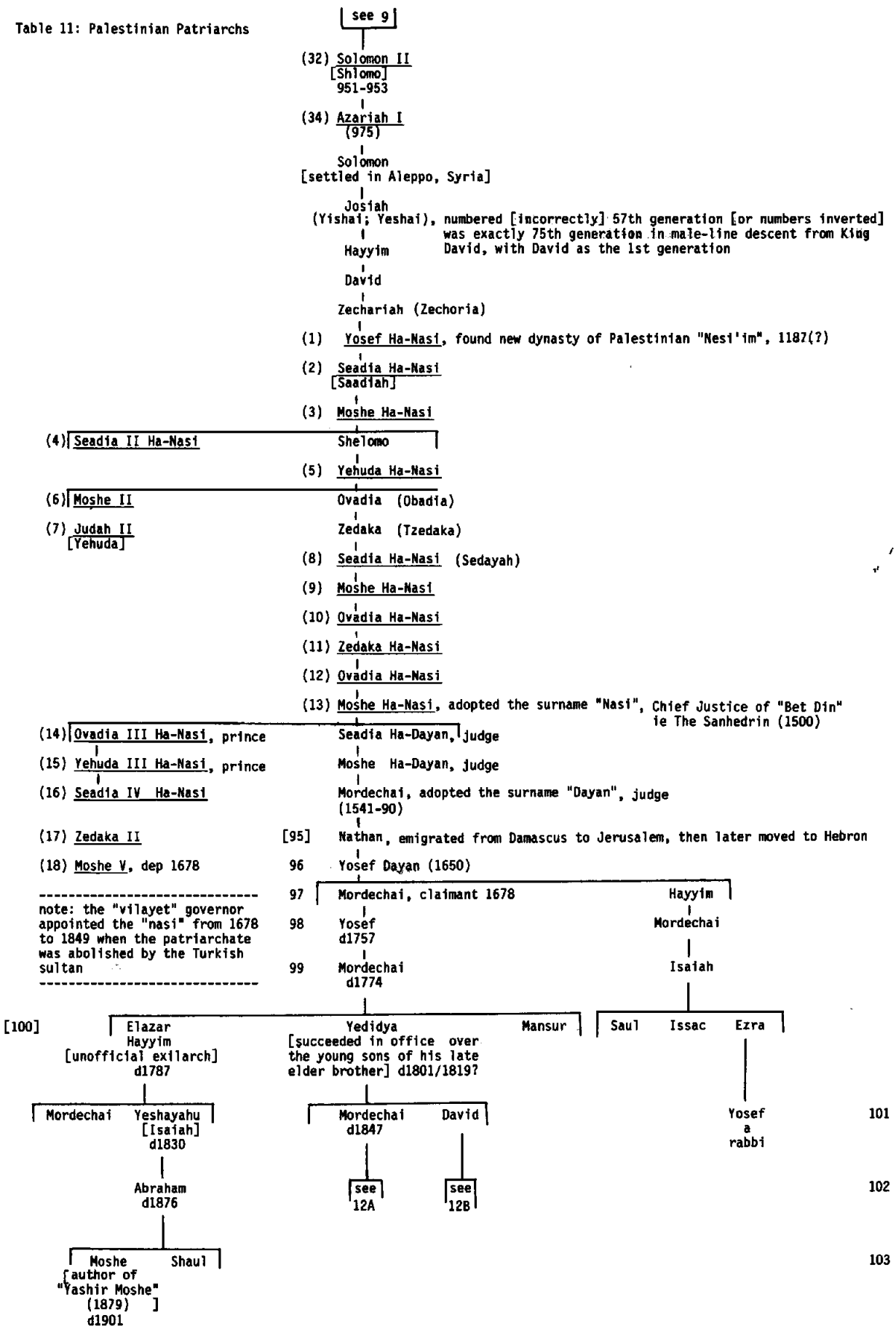


Table 11: Palestinian Patriarchs

Table 12A: modern Jewish royal house

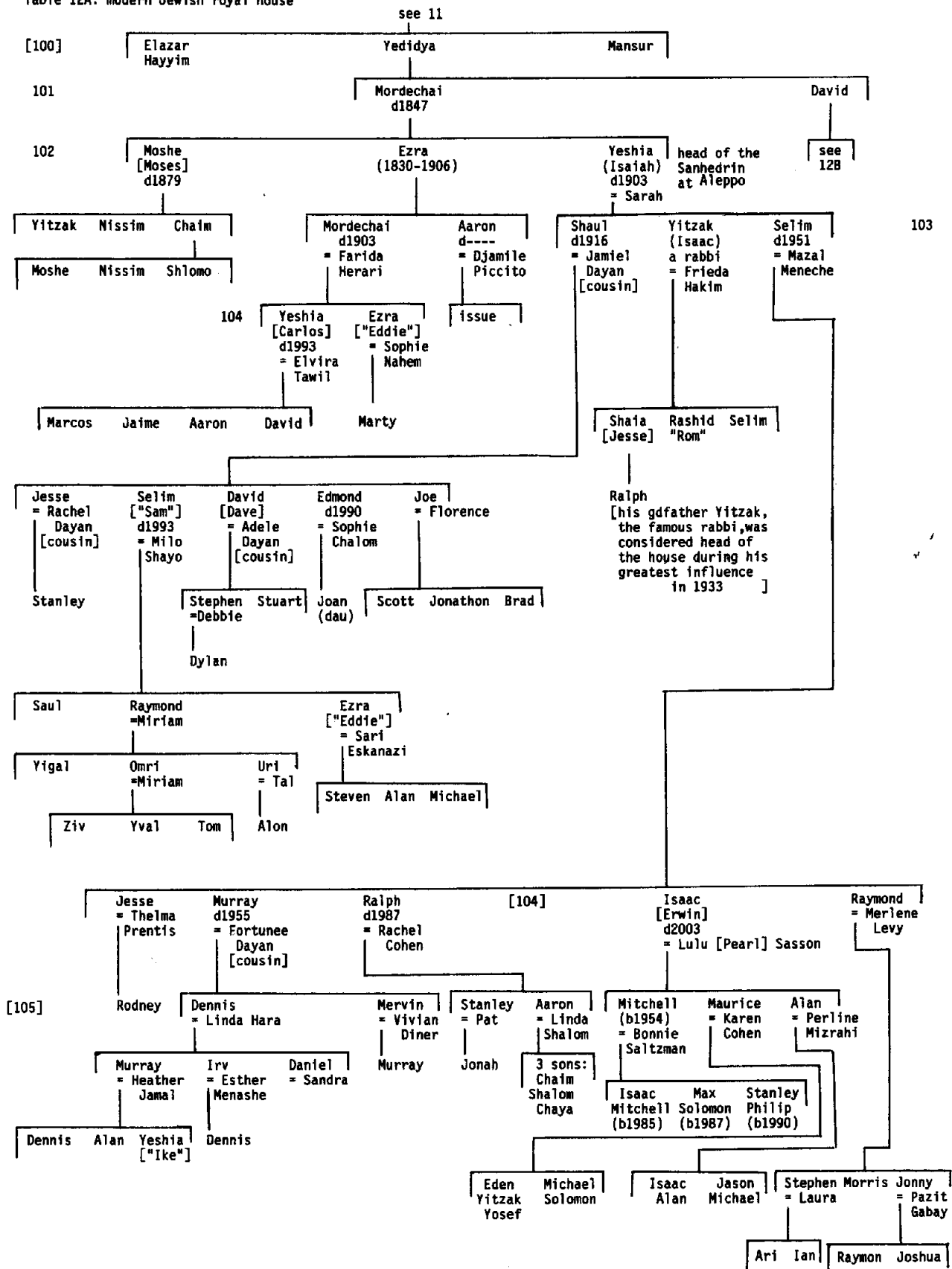


Table 12B: modern Jewish royal house

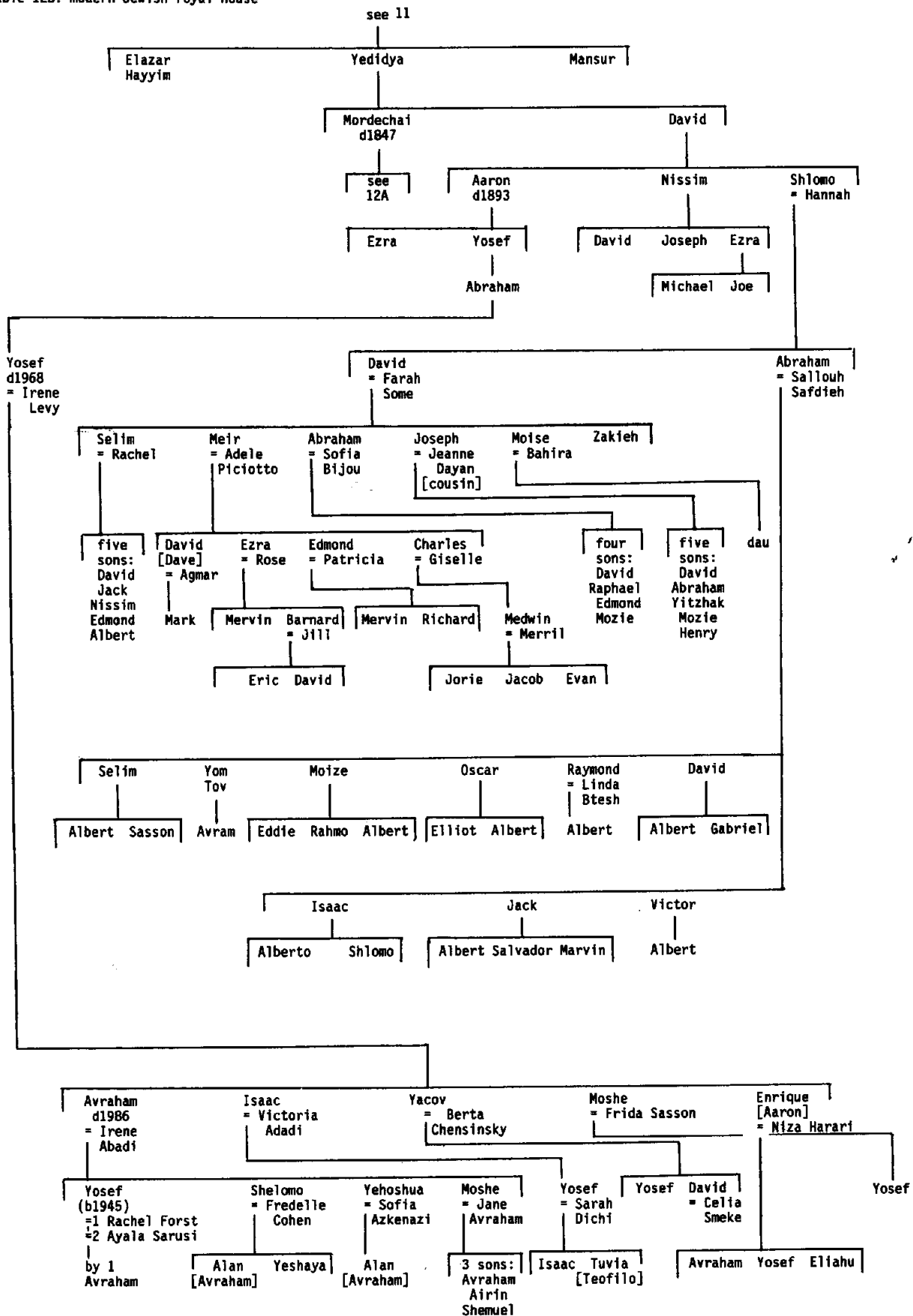


Table.13: medieval descents

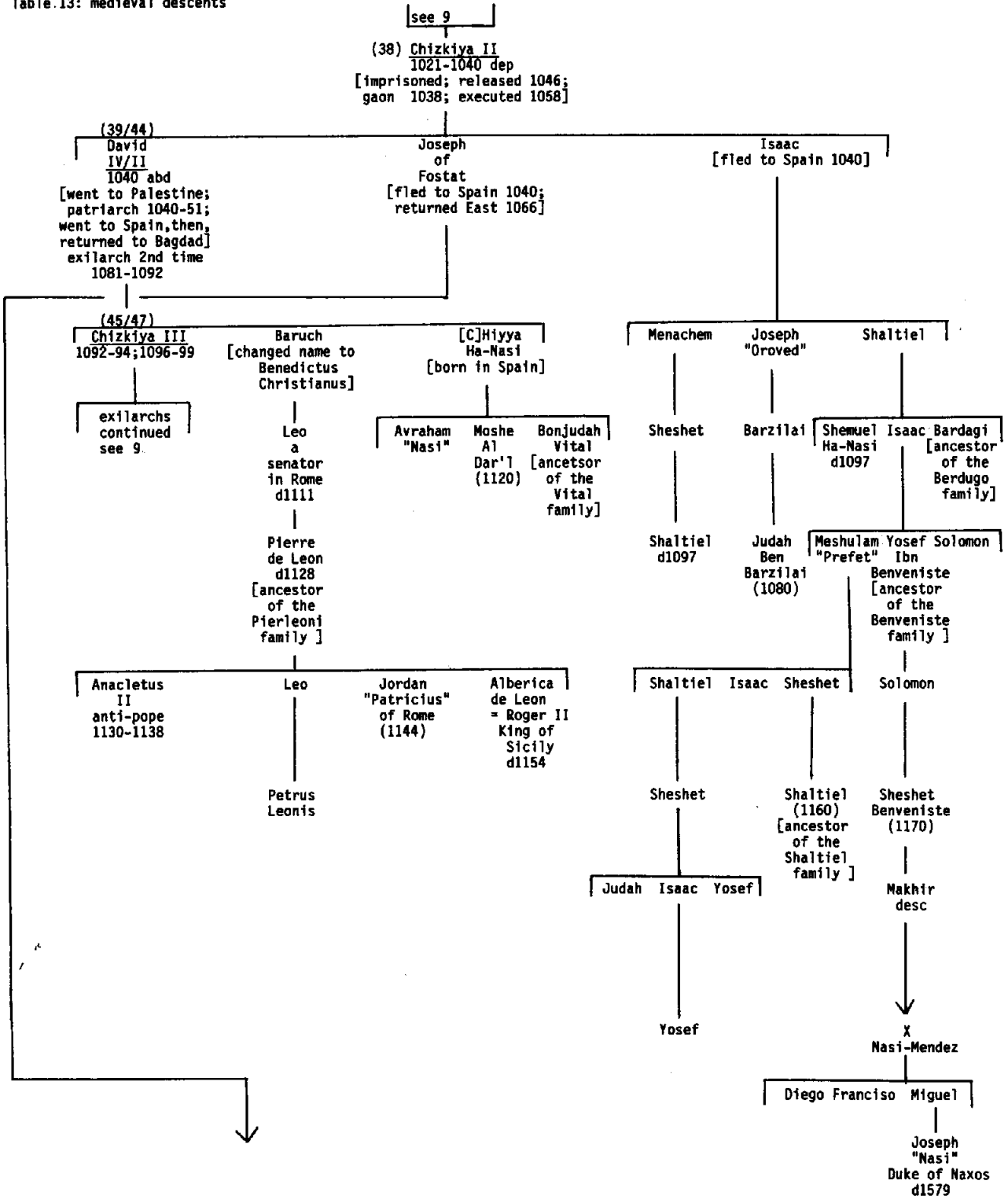


Table 14A: ancestry of "The Maharal" of Prague

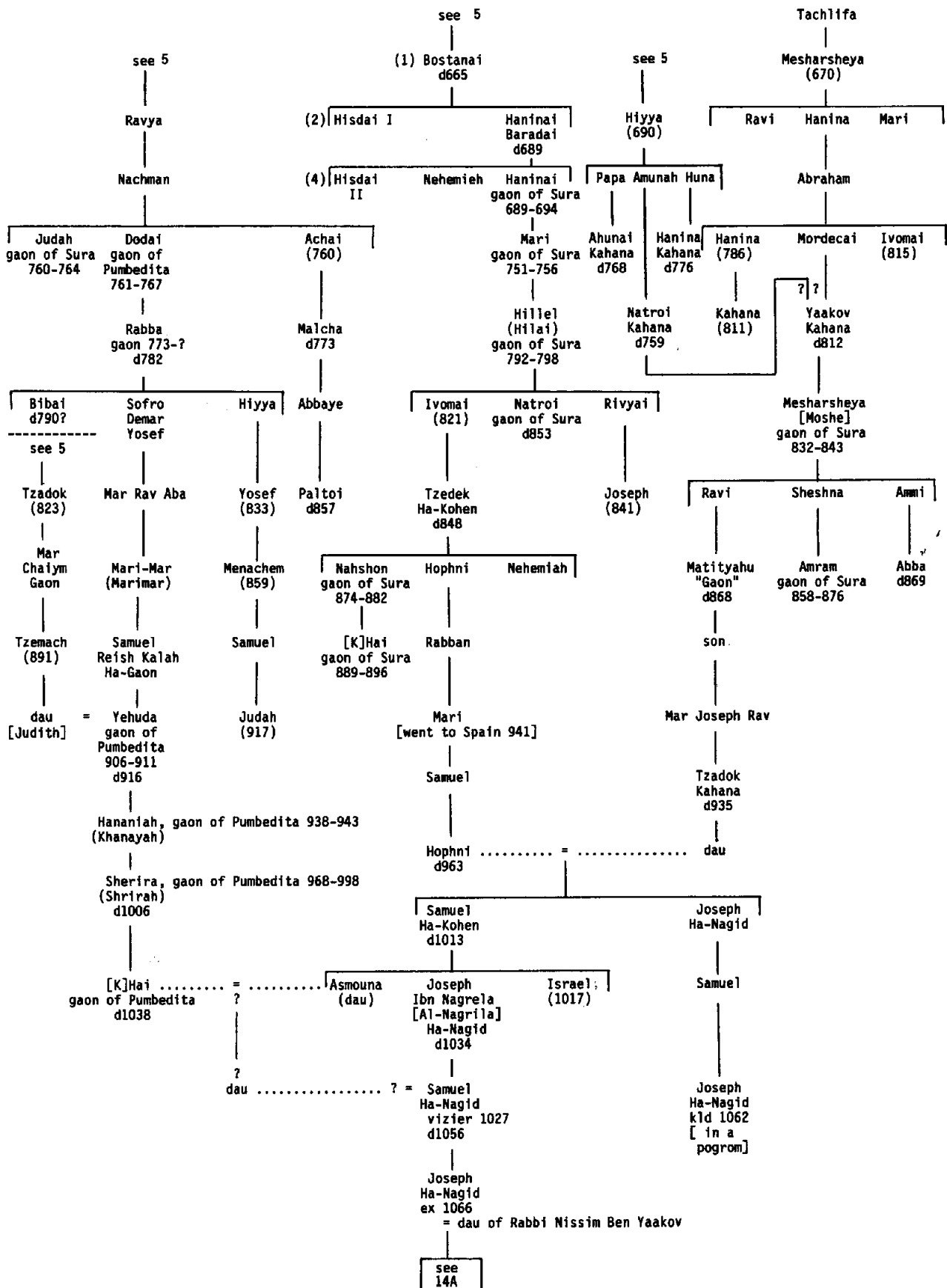


Table 14B: ancestry of "The Maharal" of Prague (continued)

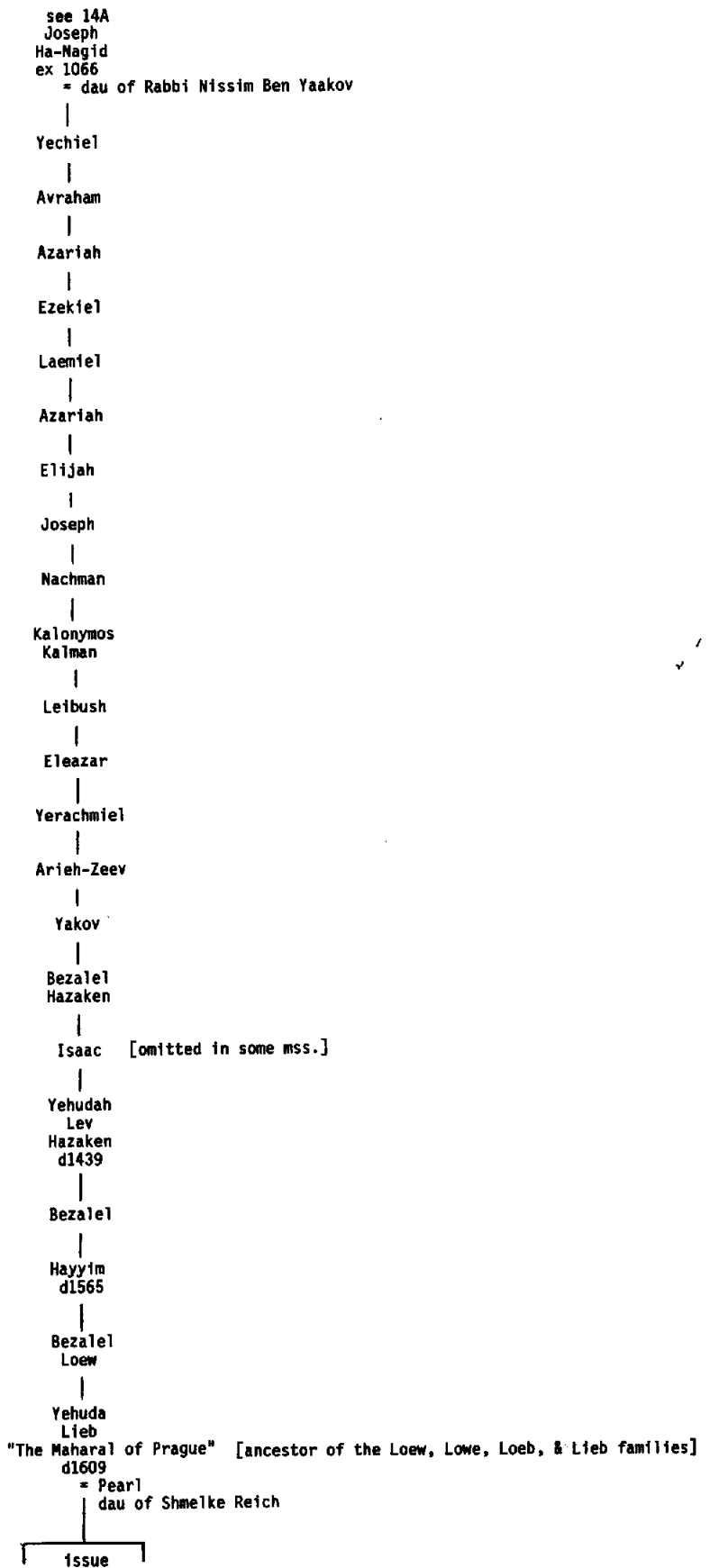


Table 15A: another Davidic descent-line

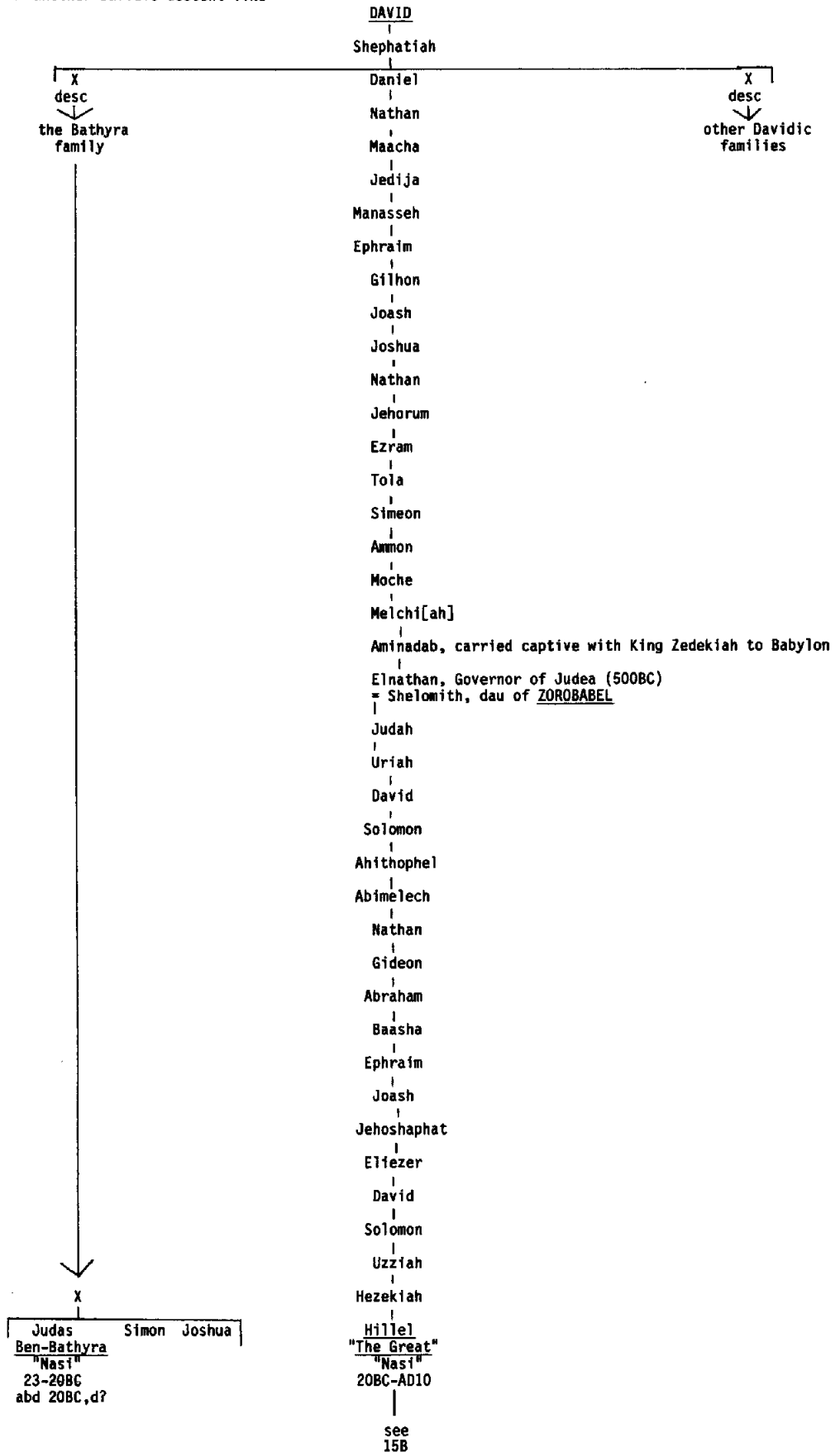
